

Upcoming

Today, the chancel choir will perform a cantata that celebrates the legacy of early American carols and hymnody. Composed in the spirit of folk music, the *Appalachian Winter* combines traditional sounds with more rustic elements creating a blend that is fresh and pleasing. Popular American carols like *Away in a Manger* and *O Little Town of Bethlehem* dance with traditional spirituals such as *Children, Go Where I Send Thee* and *Go, Tell It on the Mountain.* Sacred Harp tunes are re-tooled for Advent and stand alongside new versions of Shaker hymns and Appalachian melodies. Thoughtful narration weaves the movements together in a meaningful tapestry of song and Scripture.

Next Sunday, December 24th there will be a Christmas brunch beginning at 9:15 a.m. followed by carols in the fellowship hall (no Sunday School). The Fellowship Team will welcome anyone who wants to bring some food to share. All families are invited!

FPC will have a Christmas Eve service on Sunday, December 24th at 5:30 pm, in addition to the 11 am service. All are invited to attend!
